

CHRISTMAS ANGELS

WHAT YOU NEED: An adult's help, 5cm ceramic pot, gold acrylic paint, paintbrush, 30mm bead, craft foam, scissors, glitter, glue pen, acrylic hair, textas, pipe-cleaner

DIRECTIONS:

- 1 Paint pot gold and allow to dry.
- 2 Glue bead to the top of the pot to make the angel's head.
- 3 Cut out wings from the craft foam and decorate with glitter glue pen.
- 4 Glue wings onto the back of the pot.
- 5 Glue some hair onto the top of the bead and draw a face using textas.
- 6 Make a halo out of a pipe-cleaner and pierce the end into the craft foam so the ring of the halo sits just above the top of the angel's head.
